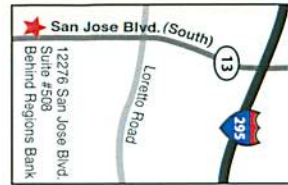

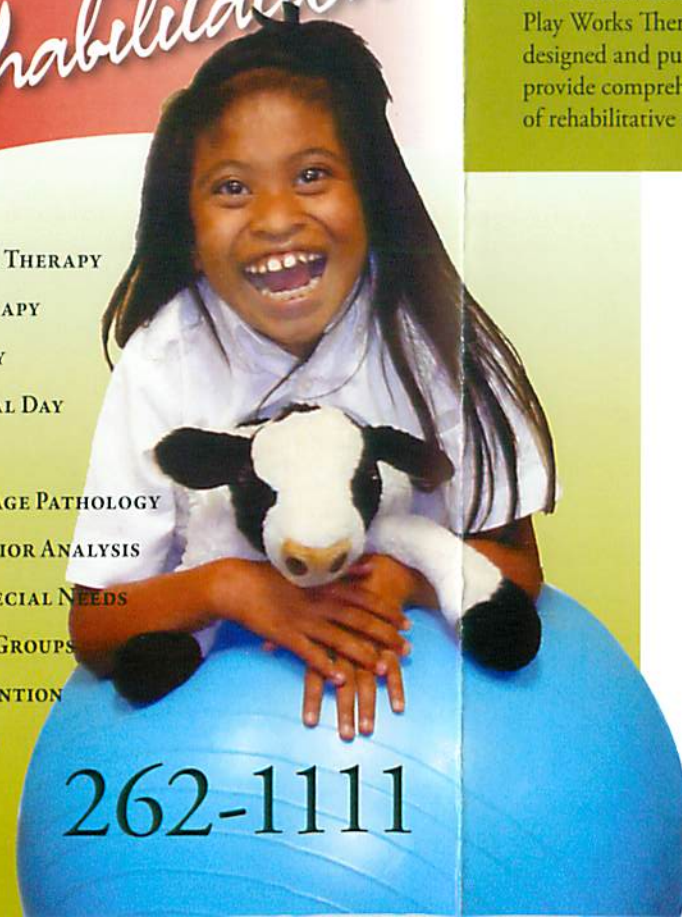

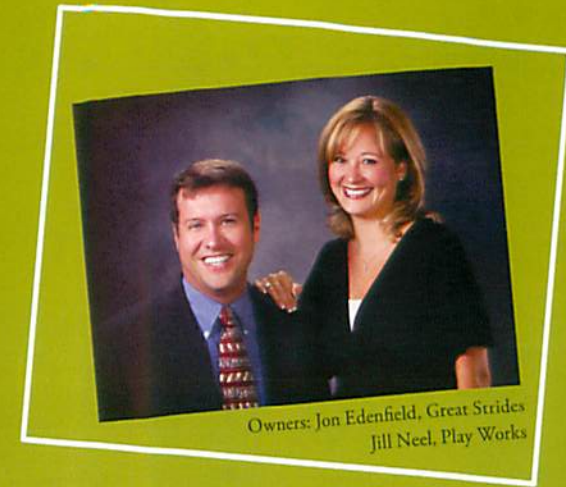

Our Services . . .

Occupational Therapy (OT)

Occupational Therapy (OT) is the enhancement of a child's participation in daily life activities or "occupations." OT seeks to minimize the effects of disease, injury, congenital defects, disability or developmental delays.

Signs that your child may need OT:

- Poor fine motor skills
- Poor handwriting
- Weak or poor muscle tone
- Poor social skills
- Heightened sensitivity to light, touch, taste, or sound
- Frequent mood changes
- Avoids being touched
- Difficulty with jumping, skipping or running
- Difficulty transitioning between tasks
- Difficulty with daily living activities such as dressing, grooming or self feeding

Physical Therapy (PT)

Physical Therapists care for children who have been injured or have gross motor problems resulting from an illness, disease, or disability.

Your child might see a physical therapist for:

- Developmental delays
- Limb deficiencies
- Cerebral palsy
- Muscle weakness
- Traumatic brain injury
- Brachial plexus injuries
- Muscular dystrophy
- Muscle or joint pain
- Orthopedic injuries
- Sports injuries
- Heart problems
- Spina bifida/spinal cord injuries
- Fetal exposure to alcohol or drugs
- Acute trauma

Speech-Language Pathology (SLP)

Speech and Language Therapy treats children with a speech and/or language disorder. Speech disorder is a problem with the actual production of sounds. A language disorder is difficulty understanding, processing or expressing (putting words together) to communicate ideas.

Some common problems that can be evaluated and managed through speech language pathology include:

- Oral and written language difficulties
- Communication difficulties related to hearing impairment
- Learning disabilities
- Cleft palate
- Hyper-nasal speech
- Voice disorders
- Difficulty pronouncing speech sounds
- Stuttering
- Feeding difficulties

Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA)

Through the use of one-on-one therapy, the behavior analyst can promote language acquisition and the reduction of inappropriate behavior. The behavior analyst (or the behavior instructor under the supervision of the behavior analyst) reduces the problematic behaviors by teaching new adaptive skills that replace the unwanted behaviors.

ABA has been proven to be extremely effective with children with Autism but is not limited solely to this disorder. A wide range of children can be seen for ABA. ABA can be used for any child who is in need of "socially significant behaviors" that can include reading, academics, social skills, communication and adaptive living skills such as toileting and dressing.



Music Therapy

Music Therapy uses music to address physical, emotional, cognitive, and social needs of individuals of all ages. Research in music therapy supports its effectiveness in a wide variety of health care and educational settings.

Interactive Metronome

A computerized brain-based rehabilitation assessment and training program targeted at increasing processing abilities.

Potential benefits include improvements such as:

- Attention and Concentration
- Aggression and Impulsivity
- Coordination
- Language Processing
- Motor Control
- Academic Performance

Private School

For Children with Special Needs

In 2007 Great Strides Rehabilitation became a registered private school with the state of Florida. This school will provide intensive individualized education based on the principals of Applied Behavior Analysis. Each child will be taught with a 1:1 or 2:1 student teacher ratio. We accept the Florida McKay scholarship to assist with tuition. Tuition will vary and enrollment is limited.

Social Skills Groups

Throughout the year we offer a variety of groups designed to support the child or adolescent in developing improved interpersonal skills.

Developmental Day Program

Play Works Therapies, P.A. offers a Developmental Day Program which is open to both typically developing children and children with special needs. We accept children from 18 months to age 6. The program is staffed with either an Infant Toddler Developmental Specialist or a Speech Language Pathologist. It is our aim to provide a low student to teacher ratio, in an environment that fosters language, cognitive and social development. The activities change every fifteen to twenty-minutes to keep the children engaged.

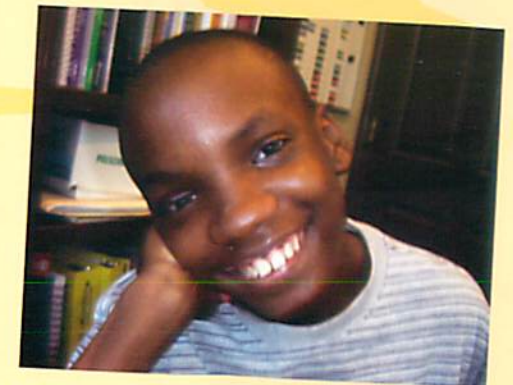
Early Intervention

Early Steps Program and Natural Environment/ In-Home Therapy Services

Play Works Therapies, P.A. is the largest provider agency in the Northeast Florida Early Steps Program. We currently provide services in the natural environment (home, child care facility, etc.) in the following counties: Clay, Duval and St. Johns.

In addition to OT, PT and ST, Play Works Therapies, P.A. employs Infant Toddler Developmental Specialists (ITDS). These specialists provide generalized developmental education and treatment for children birth to three enrolled in the Early Steps Program.
